This year's theme is: **'air pollution dirties every organ in your body – so take steps to improve your health this Clean Air Day'.**

Clean Air Day is a day of practical action and awareness raising, so we can all breathe cleaner and healthier air. Actions people should take to reduce air pollution include:

- Give your car a day off – Walk, cycle or take public transport to work or school, or work from home if you can;
- Don't idle – If you drive, turn off your engine when your vehicle is stationary and it is safe to do so;
- Discover the side streets – Use quieter streets when you're on a bike or on foot to avoid polluted main roads;
- Go electric – There are lots of ways you can travel electric. Hire an electric car, taxi or test drive an electric vehicle today;
- Only burn dry, well-seasoned wood or smokeless fuel on your stove, open fire or barbecue; and
- Create awareness by speaking to someone about air pollution and its impact on health.

UNICEF activities by Primary

Last week, the primary students carried out projects linked to the following UNICEF articles:

Article 2 (non-discrimination):

The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.

Article 8 (protection and preservation of identity):

Every child has the right to an identity. Governments must respect and protect that right, and prevent the child's name, nationality or family relationships from being changed unlawfully.

Article 30 (children from minority or indigenous groups):

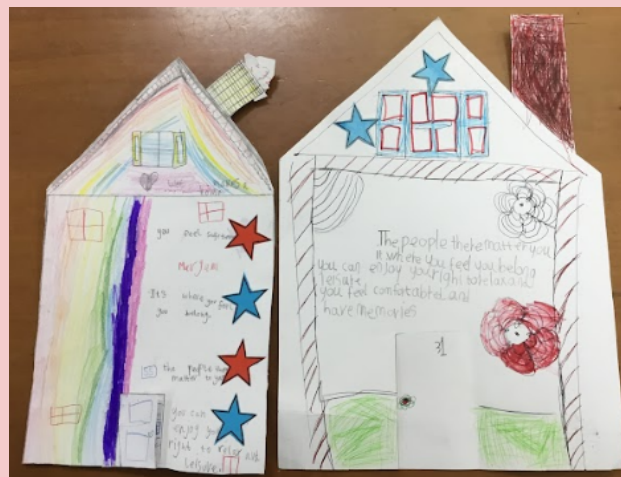
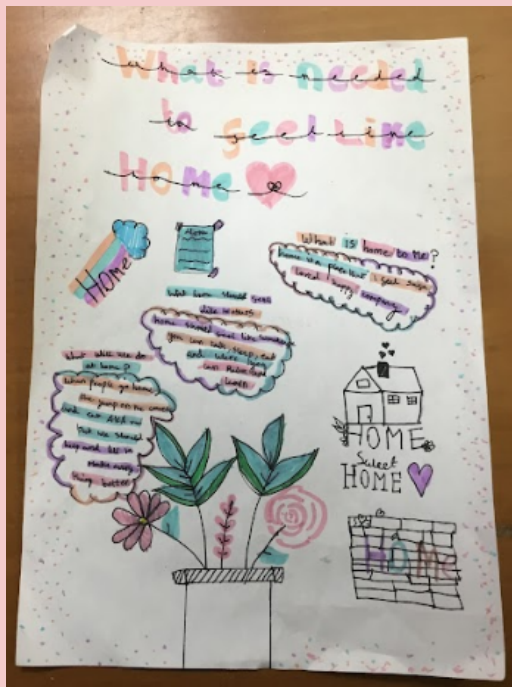
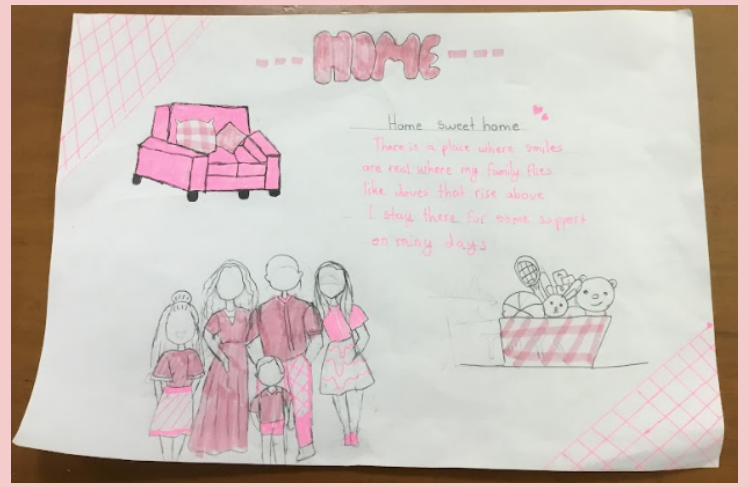
Every child has the right to learn and use the language, customs and religion of their family, whether or not these are shared by the majority of the people in the country where they live.

We are delighted to announce that we will be joining 'Forest Gate Library' for the Summer Reading Challenge 2022.

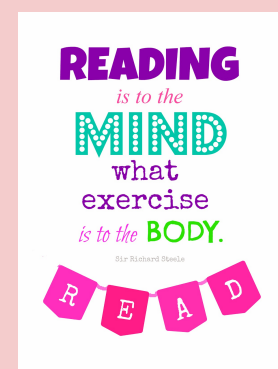
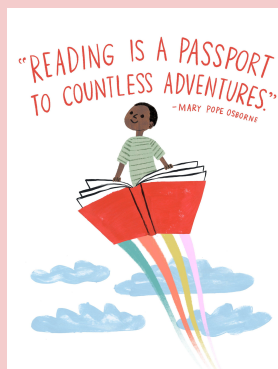
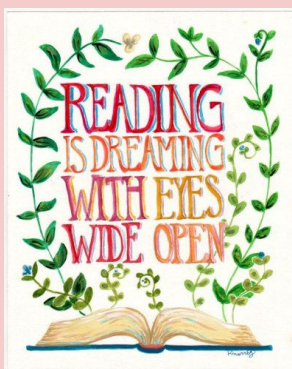
The challenge is a great way to motivate our students and help develop their love for reading. During the visit, children will have the opportunity to borrow books from the library.
