Millions of people across the UK and beyond have celebrated the coronation of King Charles III - a symbolic ceremony combining a religious service and pageantry. The ceremony was held at Westminster Abbey, with the King becoming the 40th reigning monarch to be crowned there since 1066.

The students of Quwwat-ul-Islam have reflected on the celebration of the coronation of King Charles III and the diversity of Great Britain. Students researched the history of the monarch and created posters:

The Coronation of King Charles and Queen Camilla

What will happen at the Coronation ceremony?

During the ceremony, the king will swear to uphold the law and the Church of England, be anointed with holy oil, receive the Royal Orb and be crowned with the solid gold St Edward's Crown.

Where will the coronation take place?

The coronation day starts with a procession from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Abbey in the Gold State Coach. This coach has been used at every coronation since William IV's in 1831. After the service there is traditionally a procession through the streets of London.

Interesting Facts:

- The last coronation was exactly 70 years ago held in 1953.
- King Charles III is the Son of Late Queen Elizabeth II.
- Queen Camilla Consort is Charles III second wife.
- Charles III first wife was Princess Diana who died in a car crash in 1996.
- Our next Queen will be Princess Charlotte of Wales who is currently 8 years old.
- The coronation this year takes place on Saturday May 6th 2023

1. Prince Charles Philip Arthur George was born at Buckingham Palace on 14th November 1948 at 9.14pm, weighing 7lbs 6oz. The Prince was christened on 15th December 1948 at Buckingham Palace.
2. The former Prince Charles became heir apparent (next in line to the throne) at the age of three years old in 1952, and went onto become the longest serving Prince of Wales in 2017. His Majesty was the first heir to see his mother crowned as Sovereign.
3. The King has three siblings, two sons, two step-children, five grandchildren and five step-grandchildren.
4. The first formal photograph of The King was taken by Cecil Beaton in December 1948.

Absences before or after a school holiday

If your child is absent before or after a school holiday, you must provide evidence explaining the absence. This may be medical evidence if your child is unwell or evidence of flight delays or circumstances beyond your control.

Without this evidence you risk being issued with a penalty notice.
