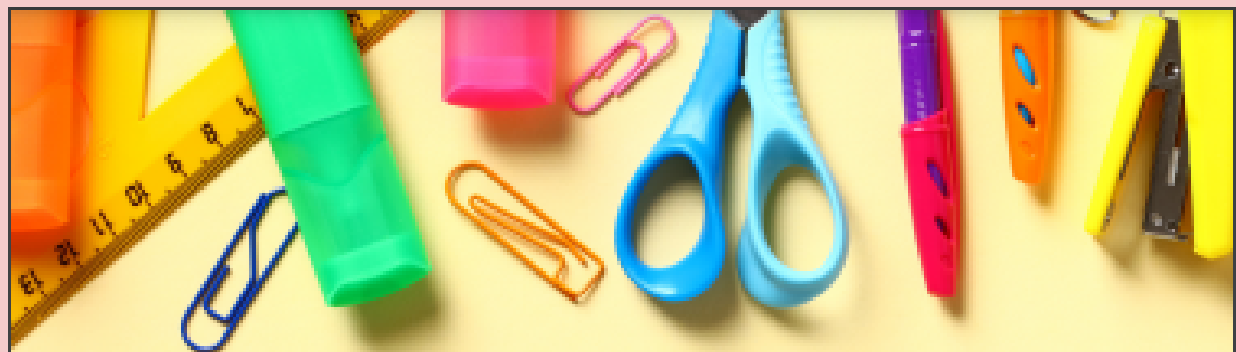

Black History Month

This month is **Black History month**. The students of Quwwat-UI-Islam Girls' School have been celebrating black history month through a series of activities including the sharing of stories by black authors and by increasing their knowledge about the contributions of black people (both past and present) in their everyday lives. The students carried out research through the internet and books and created posters, information text and videos to show what they learnt about the contribution of black people from the past and the present.

WHO WAS ROSA PARKS?



Rosa parks was born in the town of Tuskegee in Alabama, a state in southern USA. Her mother was a teacher and her father was carpenter.

She had a little brother called sylvester. After her parents got separated when she was a little girl Rosa and Sylvester moved in with their mother in Alabamas capital city.

SEGREGATION AT THE TIME!!!...

As a child Rosa parks experienced lots of racism, and saw how white people were treated differently then black people. She attended a secondary school for black children. They all had to walk to school, while the white children attended their own school and were provided with a bus to get there.



Segregation on buses!!



At bus stops at this time, there had to be two lines of people: one for black people and one for white people -This was so that when the bus arrived, the white people could take the seats at the front of the bus first. Then, the black people could get on and use any free seats at the back of the bus, and the white people got to sit on a bench.

Rosa Park's story:



On December 1st 1955, after a long day at work, Rosa boarded the bus home and sat in the first row of seats by the time the bus reached its third stop, all the "white only" seats were full. Rosa and three other black people were sitting in the front row of the black section of the bus. On December 1st 1955, after a long day at work, Rosa boarded the bus home and sat in the first row of seats intended for black people. So, the white bus driver stepped back into the bus to tell the Rosa and the three other black people to move back to give their seats to the white people intended for black people. After being asked to move by the white bus driver, the other three black people moved further back in the bus to give the white people. The driver told Rosa that if she did not move back, then he would call the police.

The bus boycott...

The bus boycott was supported by the black community and also some white people, who were growing tired of the unfair treatment of black people in their community. For 381 days, 40,000 people did not use the buses in Rosa's home city of Montgomery. They found other ways to get to work or simply walked to show their support to the cause. There were so many people involved that this could not be ignored. It was noticed by the newspapers and the rest of America.

VICTORY!!!!!!.....

Even though segregation was still in place in many other areas of society, such as restrooms and public buildings, this was a victory for equality. It made a significant start to improving the rights of the black people in society.
