Our new wudu khana

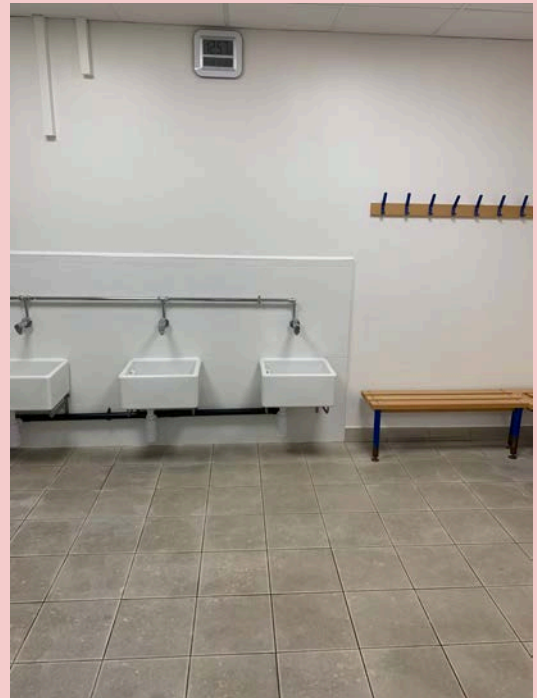

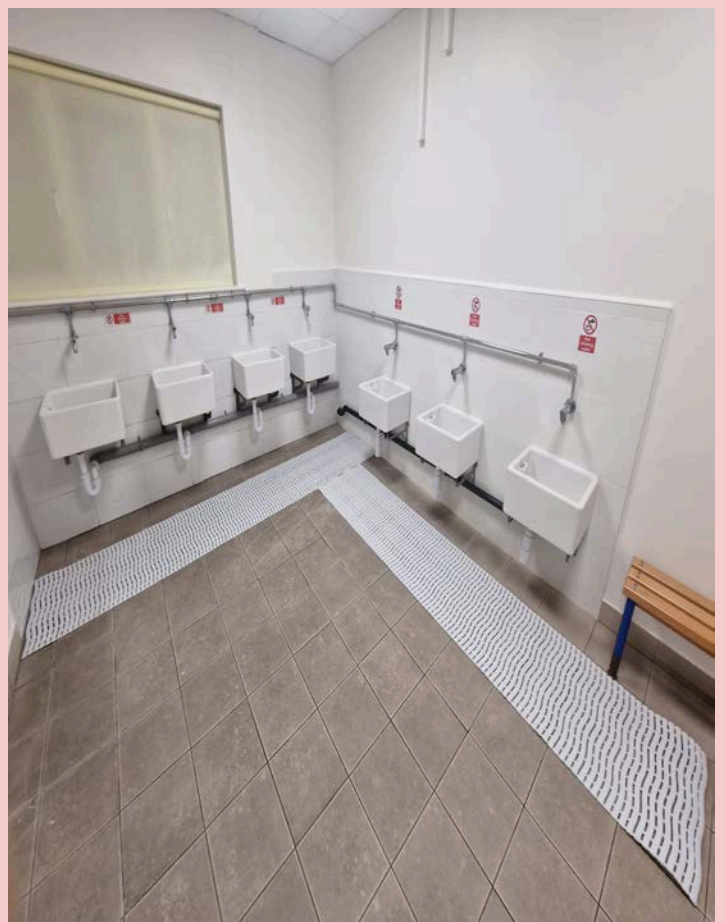

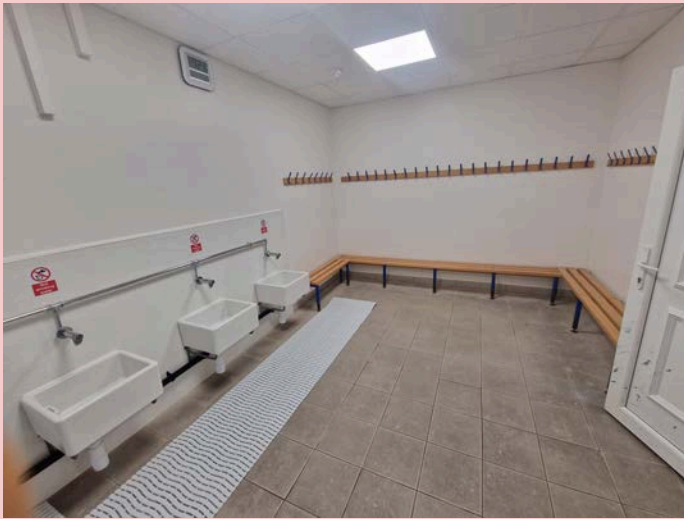

Year 11 will Insha'Allah commence their GCSE Examinations on **Monday 6th May 2024** with the final GCSE examination taking place on **Wednesday 19th June 2024**.

Targeted Learning Arrangements

Targeted learning will continue up until the beginning of the official GCSE examinations. It is very important that a regular revision routine is established at home. This should also include eating nutritious healthy meals and having a good sleeping routine.

The GCSE Examination Board has strict regulations regarding late arrivals for exams. Penalties may include reduced time given for the exam and/or exclusion from sitting the exam.

Please note: All students MUST be onsite at the **8:00am** prompt for **morning GCSE examinations**. All students MUST be onsite at **12:00pm** prompt for **afternoon GCSE examinations**.

Students are required to wear full school uniform when sitting GCSE examinations.
