## School ethos

### Our Mission and Vision

At Quwwat-ul-Islam Girls' School, we aim to provide sound Islamic education through our Islamic Studies curriculum in a caring environment, by nurturing future generations in becoming confident Muslims prepared for life in modern day Britain.

## FAQ's

### 1. Will there be an increase in fee?

There will be no increase in fees in regards to this particular change of the Islamic curriculum.

### 2. Will this be sufficient for my child if I do not send them to Madrasah?

Yes! The daily two hours will work just like a Madrasah environment nurturing your child's Islamic knowledge and character. (However on a side note, please consult your child's teacher to understand your child's level and whether extra support is required).

### 3. How many hours of Qur'an and Islamic Studies will my child study in a week?

One hour of Islamic Studies per day and one hour of Qur'an per day. Making it a total of 5 hours of Islamic Studies and 5 hours of Qur'an per day.

### 4. Will my child complete the Qur'an?

If your child has started from Reception, it is certain that Insha'Allah she will complete the Qur'an.

If pupils start from KS1 or KS2, teachers will work hard to support them in order to complete the Qur'an by Year 11, Insha'Allah.

If pupils start from KS3, depending on her Qur'anic recitation skills, she will be placed in the appropriate group. We will assist your daughter to improve her Tajweed skills allowing her to progress proficiently in her recitation.

## Introduction

At Quwwat-ul-Islam Girls' School, we are introducing a conclusive Islamic Studies curriculum, designed to meet the requirements of all students. There will be an hour of Islamic Studies and an hour of Qur'anic Studies on a daily basis. We have combined the 'Islamiyyah Series' and the 'An-Nasihah' curriculum as they provide every child the true essence and love for Islam. The lessons are interactive and include brilliant illustrations, making the understanding of our beautiful deen easier and enjoyable for our students.

Through using the 'Islamiyyah Series' for Reception to Year 3 and the 'An-Nasihah Series' from Years 4-11, it will allow us to fulfill the great responsibility that rests upon our shoulders of developing our students into successful young ambassadors for the Ummah.

All topics within this curriculum meet the demand of every child of every ability in accordance to their academic year. Pupils will be taught the beautiful teachings of Islam in a friendly, fun and interactive manner to increase in their love for Allah SWT and the Prophet (s).

## Curriculum

### Overview

The Islamic curriculum comprises of the 'An-Nasihah' and the 'Islamiyyah Series'. The 'An Nasihah' book consists of **seven** subjects. They include corresponding workbooks with differentiated activities, all referenced from authentic sources. Pupils can access the curriculum from the age of 4, in which all lessons are Dyslexia- friendly, giving every child an equal opportunity to enjoy learning about Islam.

Not many Madrasah's accept students as young as this. However, we at Quwwat-ul-Islam believe that our Deen should be accessible for every child.

### Objectives

The curriculum objectives will be successfully achieved as our teaching and learning encompasses a number of extra curricular activities such as; assemblies, specific topic-based learning, daily congregational prayers and a comprehensive curriculum delivered from Reception to Year 11. To further enhance students Islamic knowledge and understanding, Quwwat-ul-Islam Girls' school will be implementing the Islamic Studies iGCSE in Year 10.

As part of our curriculum change, we have introduced a robust method of teaching the Qur'an. Our students will be taught the basic rules of Tajweed and revisit them throughout each year in greater detail.

Our aim is to ensure your child leaves our school reciting the Qur'an to a high efficient standard. Students will be guided towards achieving this goal through interactive based Qur'an and Tajweed lessons.

Lastly, our curriculum has been developed in a way that will allow your child to attend Madrasah and School within a school day. We understand that through this pandemic we have come to realise the true importance of spending time with our loved ones. Ultimately, we believe this will allow you and your child to spend more valuable time at home together.

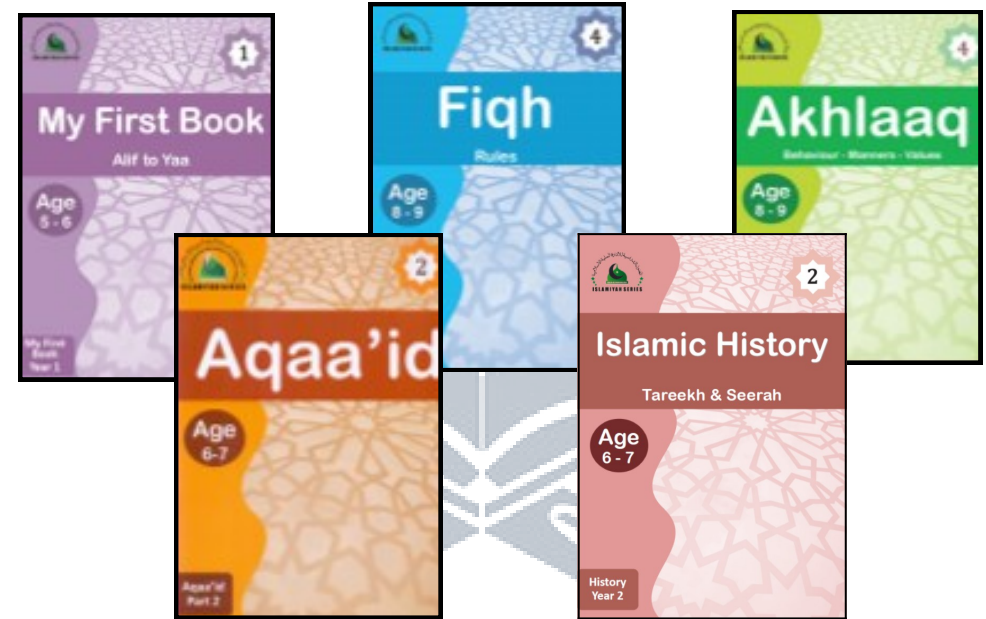

## Curriculum content

### How will your child develop and what will your child learn?

Every child at Quwwat-ul -Islam Girls' school will learn the basic principles and foundation of Islam. Students will thereafter develop a high level of understanding on various topics as they develop further into each year, enhancing their Islamic Knowledge.

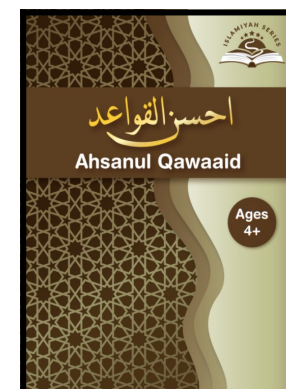
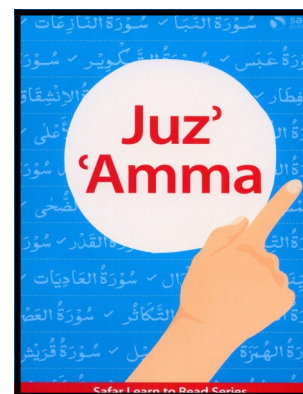
### Qurani c Stud -

This Qaidah introduces rules and procedures relating to the recognition and pronunciation of each of the 29 Arabic letters. There are 22 lessons focusing on mastering the rules and pronunciation from a very young age over a period of one year.

Lessons include;

- ⇒ Harkat (Fat'hah, Kasrah and Dhammah)
- ⇒ Tanween (Fathatain, Kasratain and Dhammatain)
- ⇒ Sukoon

Students in **Year 2** will be completing the Juz Ammah

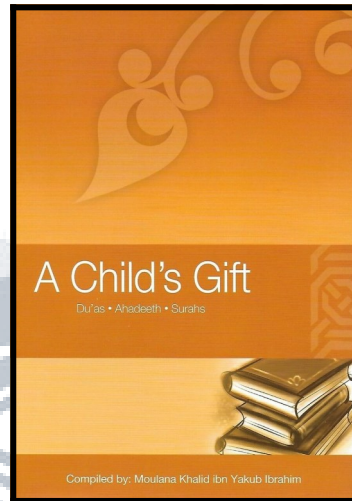


## Curriculum content

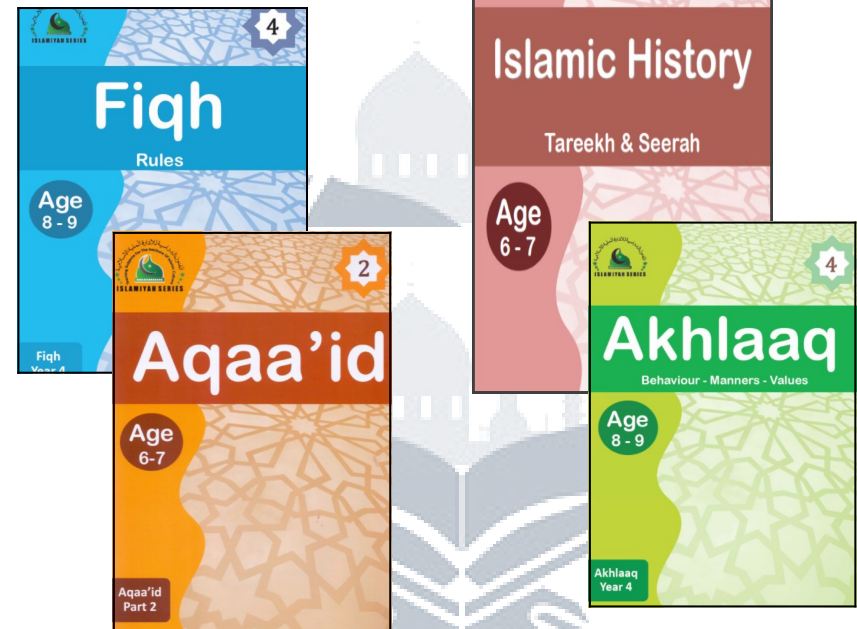
### Surah and Duaa memorisa-
