Our Mission and Vision

FAQ's

1. Will there be an increase in fee?

There will be no increase in fees in regards to this particular change.

2. Will this be sufficient for my child if I do not send them to Madrasah?

Yes! The daily two hours will work just like a Madrasah environment nurturing your child's Islamic knowledge and character. (However on a side note, please consult your child's teacher to understand your child's level and whether extra support is required).

3. How many hours of Qur'an and Islamic Studies will my child study in a week?

One hour of Islamic Studies per day and one hour of Qur'an per day. Making it a total of 5 hours of Islamic Studies and 5 hours of Qur'an per day.

4. Will my child complete the Qur'an?

If your child has started from Reception it is certain that InshaAllah she will complete the Qur'an. If your daughter starts from KS1 or KS2, staff will work hard to push them towards completing the Qur'an by year 11 InshaAllah. If your daughter starts from KS3, depending on her Qur'anic recitation skills, she will be placed in the appropriate group. We will assist your daughter to improve her Tajweed skills allowing her to progress proficiently in her recitation.

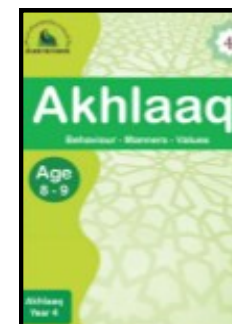
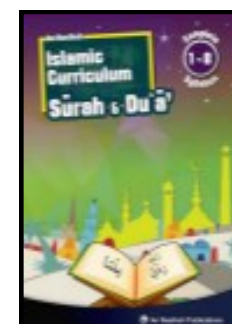
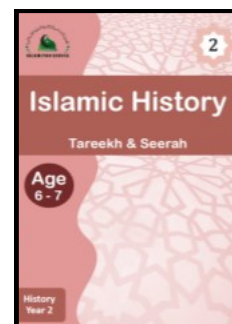
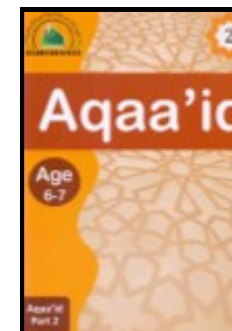
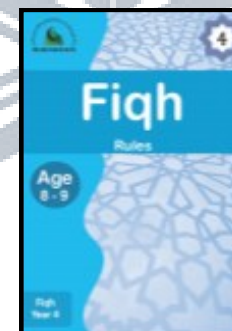
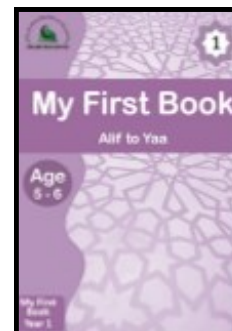


Resources

Curriculum content

How will your child develop and what will your child learn?

Every child at Quwwatul Islam Girl's school will learn the basic principles and foundation of Islam. Students will thereafter develop a high level of understanding on various topics as they develop further into each year, enhancing their Islamic Knowledge.

- ⇒ **KS1** and **KS2** will explore different principles of Islam from learning about who Allah is, to His wonderful Prophets.
- ⇒ **KS3** and **KS4** will focus on Tarikh (Islamic History), Aqa'id (beliefs), Akhlaaq and Adab (Islamic Character and etiquettes), Fiqh (rulings) Seerah and Ahadith.

Our students will receive a fruitful Islamic education in a holistic Madrasah environment. Staff will ensure that your child is given the best Tarbiyyah through our robust chosen Curriculum. With the aim of cultivating exemplary Islamic character, children will be well-grounded on Islamic fundamentals to foster a love for the religion, as well as the people around them to gain a valuable sense of community.

Pupils will be taught the Deen through practical discussions and examples, allowing them to have a fluent understanding of every topic they are taught.

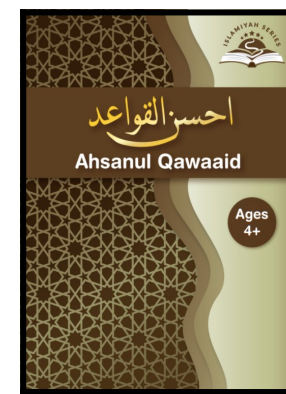
Quranic Studies

This Qaidah introduces rules and procedures relating to the recognition and pronunciation of each of the 29 Arabic letters. There are 22 lessons focussing on mastering the rules and pronunciation from a very young age over a period of one year.

Lessons include;

- ⇒ Different forms of joint letters
- ⇒ Har'kat (Fat'hah, Kasrah and Dhammah)
- ⇒ Tanween (Fathatain, Kasratain and Dhammatain)
- ⇒ Sukoon
- ⇒ Alif, Yaa and Wow Maddah
- ⇒ Tashdeed

Students in **Year 2** will be completing the Qaidah.



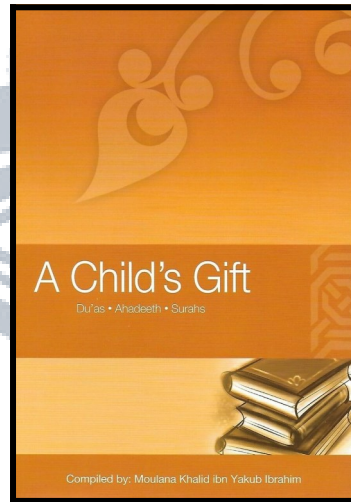

Surah and Duaa memorisation

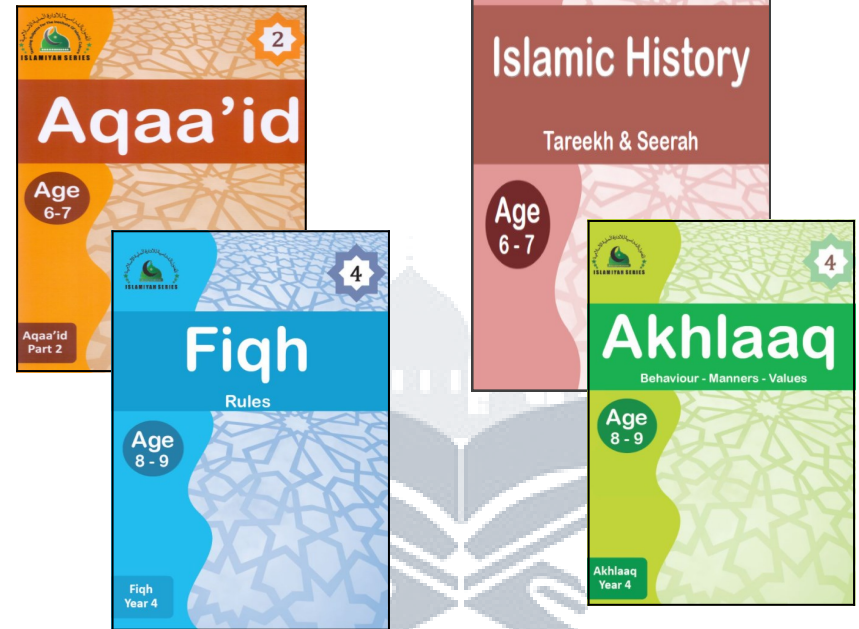
Students will learn their age appropriate duas and surah's from the An-Nashihah's very own interactive Surah and Duaa book.
