Introduction

At Quwwat-ul-Islam Girls' School we seek to ensure that all students who are admitted to the school will thrive in an environment of high academic expectation. They will be able to benefit from the rounded education provided and be happy within the school community. We recognise that it is our duty to embrace diversity and to work to overcome prejudice. We do not discriminate on grounds of diversity, race or religion.

Admissions Process

Parents/guardians can access the admissions application form via the school website: <https://quwwatulislam.com/>

It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to ensure that the school has the relevant admission documentation before the deadline for applications has passed.

On receipt of the application form parents/guardians will also be asked to forward the following information from their child's current school setting:

- Current attainment level
- Behaviour Records
- Level of attendance and punctuality

Pupils will be required to sit an entrance exam in Mathematics, English and Islamic Studies. After the papers have been marked, a space will be offered to a pupil if the following criteria are met:

- ☐ The pupil has achieved 50% or above in the Mathematics, English and Islamic studies tests
- ☐ The pupil has a level of attendance and punctuality no lower than 95%
- ☐ In the event that the pupil has marginally missed the pass mark (by no more than 5%), a space may be offered at the Head Teachers discretion
- ☐ Admission to other year groups depends solely on whether places are available
- ☐ Parent will have a period (maximum 2 weeks) to pay the admission fee, in order to secure the pupils place at the school
- ☐ Unsuccessful applicants will have the opportunity to undertake an assessment again in 3 months time to again be considered for admission.

Please note that priority for Year 7 will first be given to internal applicants from our Year 6 class. Please note that. all applications for internal admissions go live in the month of November.

Year 9 Admissions

The school does not take any applications from Year 9 and beyond (KS4)

Waiting List

The Admissions Officer will maintain a formal waiting list of applicants. New applicants that have not secured a place will be automatically placed on the QUIGS waiting list.

Places will be offered to pupils on the current waiting list as vacancies arise.

School Policies

All places are offered on the understanding that there is an acceptance by parents/students that they will abide by all the school policies and conditions under which pupils are admitted.
